## **Annual Best Practice Statement for the Governing Body of Thomas Ashton School**

**2017 - 2018**

In accordance with the Government's requirement for all governing bodies, the 3 core strategic functions of Thomas Ashton School Governing Body are:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;**
- 2. Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils;**
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.**

### **Governance arrangements**

The Governing Body of Thomas Ashton School was re-constituted in 2014 and is now made up of 2 staff governors (including the Headteacher), 2 elected Parent Governors, 1 Local Authority Governor and 5 Co-opted Governors. Co-opted governors are appointed by the Governing Body and are people who, in the opinion of the governing body, have the skills required to contribute to the effective governance and success of the school: on our Governing Body, 2 staff members (including the headteacher); 1 parent; 1 Local Authority governor and 5 Co-opted governors including the school business manager and a Deputy Headteacher from St. Andrews C of E Primary School in Hadfield. We have a vacancy for one parent governor.

The full Governing Body meets once each term, and we also have a number of committees to consider different aspects of the school in detail. At Thomas Ashton we have a Curriculum and Standards Committee, which focuses on teaching and learning, spiritual, moral, social and cultural; including British Values. Finance and Personnel Committee and a Safeguarding Committee that focuses on Safeguarding, Health and Safety. We also have committees that meet if

<p><b>Attendance record of governors</b></p>	<p>Attendance at Governor meetings has been moderate. See p5 for details of individual governors' attendance at meetings. Governors have always apologised in advance for their absence.</p>
<p><b>The work that we have done on our committees and in the governing body</b></p>	<p>The Governing Body has had a modest year. The Governing Body has a nominated governor for Safeguarding (Mrs Wallis) who reports back at meetings about any safeguarding matters.</p> <p>The challenging behaviours of our pupils can present a significant barrier to their learning. Pupils who also have identified learning needs as well as behaviour needs, the 'personalising' of the curriculum enables each pupil to learn at their own pace and level. A number of interventions are purchased to support pupils with their needs.</p> <p>As part of the Arts Award, school has participated in a number of projects with local schools and regularly displays art work in Hyde Town Hall with the encouragement from the Lord Mayor of Hyde. As a governing body we are encouraging and acknowledging the community work that is being done in within the Arts.</p> <p>The Finance and Personnel Committee regularly reviews how the school uses the budget and the challenges facing school with changes to funding and the significant cost of being in a BSF school. The governors have paid particular attention to the change of the ICT service provider and the financial consequences this has had on the budget. At the Finance and Personnel meeting in October the committee approved the 2017/18 budget plan for the school with concerns raised on the amount funding that the school receives.</p> <p>One of the roles for the governors is reviewing and agreeing school policies, and this year we have considered a number of key policies, including the Anti-Bullying Policy along with the Attendance &amp; Punctuality Policy.</p> <p>A Safeguarding Audit has been carried out and all</p>



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	<p>requirements are being met.</p> <p>Minutes of Governing Body and Committee meetings are public documents – you can obtain a copy from the school office if you would like to see any of the minutes of our meetings.</p>
<b>Future plans for the governors</b>	<p>The governing body has had to set a deficit budget for 2017/2018. A deficit recovery plan will be produced, whilst addressing this, the governors also recognise the need to plan for future refreshing of equipment that is integral to the school day i.e. ICT, Minibus.</p> <p>As part of the Specialist Schools Support Partnership, the governing bodies of all special schools are to work in collaboration.</p>
